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# **DIRECTOR'S REPORT**



With a mission to be a contextually relevant business school with world-class academic standards that develops socially-conscious managers, leaders and entrepreneurs, IIM Kozhikode is one of the fastest-growing institutions in India, today. Our vision is *Globalizing Indian Thought* inculcating authenticity, sustainability and fulfilment (Satyam, Nityam & Poornam). Since its inception in 1996, IIM Kozhikode has been aiming to groom socially conscious leaders, managers and entrepreneurs—who contribute not just to the society, but to the planet as well. IIM Kozhikode is committed to excellence in management education, research and training and establishing a presence in the emerging segments of management education. The institute has been consistently ranked as the premier management school in the country by several national agencies and is now on the verge of completing global triple accreditation.

It gives me great pleasure to briefly touch upon the Institute's achievements and accolades in the year under review, which are further detailed in the succeeding pages.

# 1. ENROLMENT OF STUDENTS TO REGULAR ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

The Institute currently conducts five regular academic programmes viz. 1) Doctoral Programme in Management (DPM), 2) Post Graduate Programme in Management (PGP), 3) Post Graduate Programme in Finance (PGP-Finance), 4) Post Graduate Programme in Liberal Studies and Management (PGP-LSM), and 5) Post Graduate Programme in Business Leadership (PGP-BL). The programme-wise enrolment of students to the above academic programmes during the year 2021-22 are as under:

# 2. ENROLMENT OF STUDENTS TO LONG DURATION EXECUTIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMMES

The Institute currently conducts three long duration Executive Education Programmes viz. 1) Doctoral Programme in Management-Practice Track (DPM-PT), 2) Executive Post Graduate Programme – Interactive Learning Mode (EPGP) and, 3) Executive Post Graduate Programme – Kochi Campus (EPGP-Kochi). The programme-wise enrolment of students to the above executive education programmes during the year 2021-22 are as under:

## 3. Management Development & Faculty Development Programmes

IIMK has been a pioneer in developing and offering short duration Management Development Programmes (MDPs) which are designed keeping in view the ever changing demands on business/professional executives. The programme content is constantly reviewed and changes made therein on a continuous basis. The objective of the MDPs is to help improve management systems and practices by providing relevant training to the executives of different sectors of the economy operating at different levels in the organizational hierarchy.

During the year, the Institute conducted one Faculty Development Programme (FDP) and a total of **103** Management Development Programmes (MDPs) which include one open MDP, 29 sponsored MDPs (conducted over a period of 116 days with 940 participants), 53 eMDPs (involving 6141 learning hours with 4141 participants) and 20 Asynchronous MDPs (involving 2528 learning hours with 1752 participants). A total of 6851 participants attended the MDPs conducted by the Institute during the reporting year.

## 4. Twentyfourth Annual Convocation

The 24<sup>th</sup> Annual Convocation of the Institute was held on 09<sup>th</sup> April 2022 wherein 468 students of PGP received their Degrees. Eleven (11) students of the Doctoral Programme in Management (DPM), 60 students of PGP-Business Leadership, 40 students of PGP-Finance, 40 students of PGP-Liberal Studies & Management, and 343 students of Executive Post Graduate Programme in Management also received their degrees during the Convocation. Shri Arif Mohammed Khan, Hon'ble Governor of Kerala delivered the Convocation Address.

## 5. Research, Publications & Conferences

The faculty members and Fellow students of the Institute undertake research on a wide range of interesting and important issues which get published in reputed scholarly publications.

During the year,

- the faculty members published 110 journal articles which include 8'A\*' and 33 'A' category publications and three **FT-50** category publications,
- a total of 74 working papers and 49 case studies were published by the faculty members,
- two issues of IIM Kozhikode Journal 'Society and Management Review' were published, and
- three Small Grant Research Projects were started and 7 research seminars conducted.

#### Conferences

During the year, the Institute organized the following Conferences:

- 08<sup>th</sup> Pan IIM World Management Conference was organised during December 16-18, 2021.
- 02<sup>nd</sup> International Conclave on *Globalizing Indian Thought* (GIT 2021) was conducted during December 16-18, 2021.

#### 6. International Collaborations

The Institute's International Exchange Programme endeavours to work with partner institutions to develop mutually beneficial, scholarly and social engagements between students and faculty members across the globe. During the year, 16 students from the Institute attended exchange programme at 8 different partner universities spread across Europe. Memorandum of Understanding for international collaboration has been signed with 10 new Universities/B-Schools of USA, UK, France, Taiwan, Belgium and Italy.

# 7. Accreditations & Ranking

IIMK's career-best fourth rank in NIRF 2021, the second rank in ARIIA 2021, and bagging the coveted EQUIS Accreditation make its silver jubilee year all the more special.

By climbing two positions, IIMK attained fourth rank in the coveted NIRF (National Institutional Ranking Framework) or India Rankings 2021. IIMK's overall score improved from 69.96 in 2020 to 73.34 in 2021. IIM Kozhikode is the sole IIM to Feature in ARIIA (Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements) 2021 by securing second rank among Institutes of National Importance, Central University & CFIs (Non-Technical) category.

IIMK was awarded EQUIS (EFMD Quality Improvement System) Accreditation on 28 September 2021 by European Foundation for Management Development (EFMD) and became the fifth IIM to bag EQUIS Accreditation. IIMK was the first IIM to receive AMBA (Association of MBAs) Accreditation in 2010. In the QS Executive MBA Rankings 2021, IIMK's EPGP was ranked 151+ globally and 16+ in Asia. As per the QS Masters in Management Rankings 2022, IIMK's Post Graduate Programme (PGP) is among the top ten programmes in Asia. Globally, the programme is ranked in the 141-150 Category. IIMK enjoys the 4-palmes category in the Eduniversal Rankings 2021. The fourth rank in 'The Week Hansa Research Best B School Survey 2021' and the 'Super League-1 category' in 'The Business Standard B School Survey 2021' are some of the other important achievements of the Institute in the year 2021-22.

#### 8. Awards & Recognition

Of the various awards and recognitions that the Institute received during the year, a few are mentioned below:

- The Association of Indian Management Scholars selected IIM Kozhikode for the AIMS International Institutional Appreciation Award, in recognition of its outstanding contribution to AIMS International Management Education.
- The Institute has been selected for the award of District Green Champion 2021-22 by Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education, for the exemplary work done by the Institute at its campus and neighbourhood.
- Mr. Sandeep Yadav (doctoral student) received SAJBS- best paper editor's choice award for his paper titled "Foreign Entry Timing, Time Since First Entry and Internationalization Speed of SMEs: Moderating Role of Manager Domestic Experience" at INDAM-2022 Conference.
- Ms. Shailly Chaurasia, Ph.D. scholar, and co-authors Prof. Rupesh Kumar Pati, Prof. Sidhartha S. Padhi received *Emerging Market Showcase Award* in the prestigious DECISION SCIENCE INSTITUTE (DSI), 52<sup>nd</sup> Annual Conference for the paper titled "Is Localization Better than Globalization? Evidence from the Nutraceuticals for Indian Malnourished Children".
- Mr Harmeet Singh, PGP-BL student was one of the `*75 creative minds of tomorrow*' selected for the 52nd International Film Festival of India (IFFI). He was handpicked by the selection jury and grand jury appointed by the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting (MIB) (Govt. of India) from across the country for IFFI.
- Prof. G. Anand has been awarded the "Outstanding Professor in Lean Six Sigma" by the Industrial Engineering and Operations Management Society International headquartered in Michigan, USA
- Prof. Chitwan Lalji's joint proposal submission to the J-PAL Cash Transfers for Child Health (CaTCH) Initiative, titled "*Maternal knowledge, wellbeing & child health: Evidence from the Indian slums*" has been awarded full funding in the amount of \$19,764 by J-PAL which is a global research center working to reduce poverty.
- Prof. Prantika Ray was selected for the prestigious Paul R. Lawrence Fellowship in the North American Case Research Association Conference 2021.
- The paper co-authored by Prof. Keyoor Purani and Prof. Deepak S. Kumar, titled "*The indirect experience of nature: biomorphic design forms in servicescapes*" published in the Journal of Services Marketing has won the award for highly commended paper as part of Journal of Services Marketing Annual Best Papers Awards 2021.

#### 9. Students' Placement

• <u>Summer Placements</u>: The Institute successfully closed the summer placements drive for the 25<sup>th</sup> batch of PGP and 2<sup>nd</sup> batches of PGP-LSM and PGP-Finance in three days' time. The entire process was carried out through a virtual placement drive which witnessed encouraging participation from recruiters. The season attracted participation from 132 reputed companies which rolled out offers to 559 students.

#### • Final Placements:

**PGP Batch-24 and first batch of PGP-LSM & PGP-Finance:** The Institute witnessed a 100% placement this year. Offers were rolled out by 116 recruiters for a cohort of 546 students from the 24<sup>th</sup> batch of PGP and the first batches of PGP-LSM and PGP-Finance.

**PGP-BL:** Final placements of the second batch of PGP-BL was successfully completed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of February 2022 in virtual mode. The Institute witnessed 100% placements for the 53 students participated in the process. Total of 52 conglomerates participated in the process.

#### **10. Faculty strength & Enrichment**

Our faculty is one of the finest in the country and is recognized internationally for their quality of research, teaching and curriculum development. There has been a substantial increase in faculty strength of the Institute during the year. With the joining of 8 new faculty members this year alone, the faculty strength of the Institute rose to 97. The number of female faculty members on the roll is 26 which corresponds to more than 26% of the total faculty strength.

Several Faculty members presented their papers in their area of expertise and interest in various conferences and seminars at national and international level. A few faculty members worked as resource persons in different workshops, and served as experts, and conducted and chaired sessions in conferences, seminars and workshops.

#### 11. Augmentation of Campus Infrastructure

The campus development activities implemented during this period continued to keep pace with the Institute's growing academic requirements. As part of the 1<sup>st</sup> Stage of IIMK's Phase V Campus development, the construction of Package 1 sports facilities (comprising the multipurpose/football field) had been substantially completed and Package 2 sports facilities (consisting of outdoor tennis courts, indoor squash courts & swimming pool) was in advanced stage of completion during this period, following easing of the COVID-19 pandemic related restrictions.

The unique facility of IIMK 'Gurukul', created by carrying out refurbishment/ retrofitting works in the atrium space of the existing Library building in the Campus, was dedicated to the Institute's community.

#### **12. IIMK LIVE**

IIMK LIVE, business incubator and entrepreneurship development centre of IIM Kozhikode made significant progress in growing its influence within the fast evolving start-up ecosystem During the year, the center admitted 17 new startups, conducted 23 online workshops/ webinars to support incubatees and provided seed funding of Rs. 2.5 Crores to 17 startups. The center was the first incubator to be selected by the Department for Promotion of Investment and Internal Trade (DPIIT) for executing its Startup India Seed Fund Scheme (SISFs) nationally. Under this scheme the center supported 6 startups with a total funding of Rs.1.8 Cr. The center has also been selected by the Department of Science and Technology(DST) to execute an Accelerator program under the theme 'AI/ML across sectors' in partnership with Deloitee and with Mangalore Refinery and Petrochemicals Limited (MRPL). The Centre supports students' entrepreneurship cell on campus and conducted various awareness programs for students including the annual start up-investor meet 'Start-O-Sphere' in March 2022, in which 30 shortlisted start-ups and 15 investors participated virtually.

I would like to acknowledge gratefully, the support received in abundant measure from the Faculty, Staff, Students and Alumni of the Institute who put in their best for the overall growth of the Institute. I am also highly indebted to the Chairman and Members of the Board of Governors of the Institute for their visionary guidance and support. The unconditional and wholehearted support of both the Govt. of India and Govt. of Kerala that we enjoy, reflects the trust the Centre and State have in us.

I seek the continued co-operation from all stakeholders in our endeavour to raise the bar and set higher benchmarks for ourselves and for the rest of the country.

# POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME IN MANAGEMENT

The two year Post Graduate Programme (PGP) in Management of the Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode (IIMK) offers a judicious blend of theory and practice, and is consciously designed to be change oriented. The course curriculum is continually reviewed and updated to cater to the requirements of the industry and reflect changes in the environment. A unique feature of the PGP is its in-built concern for the larger society as reflected in the design of the curriculum, which aims at nurturing ethically conscious and socially responsible leaders of the future. The Programme is accredited by the Association of MBAs (AMBA).

The course structure has been adopted after conducting an in-depth exercise by a select committee with inputs from a variety of stakeholders including the Alumni, Recruiters and Faculty. The course curriculum also includes an Immersive Course (6 credits), Business Models for Digital Economy, Society and Business, Sustainability and Business, Innovation and Design Thinking. The PGP concentrates on subjects in diverse functional areas during first year, equipping the student with basic skills and knowledge needed at the managerial level in any organization. During the second year, students can select subjects in their area of interest. Elective Courses are offered in Finance, Accounting & Control, Marketing, Information Technology & Systems, Quantitative Methods & Operations Management, Economics, Strategy, and Humanities & Liberal Arts. Immersive Leadership Discovery (ILD) is an important element in PGP curriculum - weighing six credits in the program. The programme lays great emphasis on knowledge assimilation and towards this end, it uses a wide variety of pedagogies like lectures, case studies, exercises, role-plays, simulation, video shows etc. ensuring a holistic perspective on the economic, technical, cultural and global impact of business.

The classes for Term IV of PGP 24 batch commenced on June 28, 2021 in online mode. A total of 470 students registered for Term IV (including 1 DPP, 1 repeater and one IE student). Two students of PGP 24 batch had opted for Differentially Paced PGP (DPP). Out of the total 469 students in PGP 24, 467 students were eligible to be promoted to the second year. Two students had opted for Differentially Paced PGP (DPP) and joined with PGP 25 first year. There was one DPP student from the PGP 23 batch and one student from PGP 23 batch was repeating the second year with PGP 24 batch.


## New Batch:

The Registration, Orientation and Inauguration of the PGP 25 batch was held in online mode. The Inauguration was held on June 30, 2021. The Orientation programme for the batch was held during June 23-29, 2021. During the orientation, HBSP (Harvard Business School Publishing) online course was conducted which included Excel Workshop – 'Spreadsheet modelling online course Excel 2013 and Mathematics for Management'. 'Etiquette Workshop' highlighting on Preparing Future-Ready Professionals was conducted by Kavyata. Dr. R.S Sodhi, Managing Director at GCMMF Ltd. (AMUL) was the Chief Guest at the event. PGP 25 Term I online classes started on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2021.A total of 503 students finally registered for the Post Graduate Programme and out of which the number of female students is 198. Two students of Batch 24 who had opted for the Differentially Paced Post Graduate Programme (DPP) joined the programme with PGP 25. Thirty one students had withdrawn due to various reasons.. Three students of PGP 25 had opted for DPP. Thus, the total strength of PGP 25 batch is 471 at the end of academic year 2021-22.



#### Structure of the Programme:

A practical mix of different teaching methods, evolved using feed-backs from students and other programme participants, is employed in the PGP. The importance is on learning processes and learning outcomes for the augmentation of managerial abilities. The problem solving and analytical skills are honed through case studies, which are part of pedagogy in most of the courses. The PGP also provides direct student links with industry and enhancement of application skills through projects undertaken for industry by students.

The first year of the programme is devoted to building up basic competence among students in core areas and in developing a holistic and socially mindful attitude to management. Courses in the first year are compulsory for all students. The aim of the compulsory package is to provide students with the fundamental knowledge, skills and techniques, contextual understanding, and overall perspective, necessary for general management. Considering the importance of the compulsory, foundation-building courses offered in the first year, a substantial portion of the teaching load was taken on by the permanent faculty of the Institute. The Summer Internship provide the testing grounds for intense learning experience.

The second year provides the opportunity to gain greater depth of skills and capability in chosen areas of study. Apart from the compulsory course of Integrative Business Simulation, the PGP offers the following optional courses in the second year of the course.

IIMK's Post-Graduate Programme in Business Leadership (PGP-BL) is specially crafted to combine academic instruction with global exposure, and deep sensitization to critical aspects of leadership and responsible business, fashioned through a development regime that enables personalized learning and reflection. By facilitating the holistic development of young professionals with experience, this programme aims to provide industry 'on a platter', well-rounded managers with strong leadership potential - Capable, confident, multi-dimensional, empathetic, mindful and values-centric future leaders who can 'hit the ground running'. #### Admission

## **Academic Sessions**



# POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME IN LIBERAL STUDIES & MANAGEMENT (PGP-LSM)

In line with the vision to innovate and excel in business education, Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode introduced an innovative Post Graduate Programme in Liberal Studies & Management. PGP-LSM is a two-year full-time residential programme hat provides in-depth coverage in terms of lessons from liberal studies and core management principles in the first year followed by advanced courses and electives in the second year. The programme lays great emphasis on knowledge assimilation and towards this end, it uses a wide variety of pedagogies like lectures, case studies, exercises, role-plays, simulation, video shows etc. ensuring a holistic perspective on the economic, technical, cultural and global impact of business

PGP-LSM concentrates on subjects in diverse functional areas during first year, equipping the student with basic skills and knowledge needed at the managerial level in any organization. During the second year, students can select subjects in their area of interest. Elective Courses are offered in Marketing Management, Quantitative Methods & Operations Management, Economics, Humanities & Liberal Arts in Management, and Organisational Behaviour & Human Resource Management. It also has modules on International and Rural immersion that the participants need to engage in the second year. Master's thesis and Business Plan Project in the second year are other unique features of course.

PGP-LSM programme is designed to integrate and equip participants to pursue careers in managerial roles in marketing, human resource management, media, social enterprise, hospitality, healthcare or in other people facing roles. These are the roles that require a holistic perspective and 'Diversity of thoughts' which PGP-LSM aims to develop. PGP-LSM is a unique offering, with the primary objective to prepare future managers by enabling them to acquire emotional, cultural, and creative intelligence.

# **PROGRAMME STRUCTURE**

The importance is on learning processes and learning outcomes for the augmentation of managerial abilities. The problem solving and analytical skills are honed through case studies, which are part of pedagogy in most of the courses. The Post Graduate Programme also provides direct student links with industry and enhancement of application skills through projects undertaken for industry by students.

The first year of the programme is devoted to building up basic competence in core areas and in developing a holistic and socially mindful attitude to management. Courses in the first year are compulsory for all students. The aim of the compulsory package is to provide participants with the fundamental knowledge, skills and techniques, contextual understanding, and overall perspective, necessary for general management. Considering the importance of the compulsory, foundation building courses offered in the first year, a substantial portion of the teaching load was taken on by the permanent faculty of the Institute. The Summer Internship provides the testing grounds for intense learning experience.




## **Registration, Orientation & Inauguration**

## Introduction

In line with the vision to innovate and excel in business education, the Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode (IIMK) has introduced an innovative Post Graduate Programme in Finance (PGPFinance) to equip candidates with the necessary skills to lead the growth in the financial services sector in the Academic Year 2020-21.

PGP- Finance is a two-year full-time master's level programme designed to equip students to pursue careers in the financial world, in domains such as corporate finance, investment banking, and wealth management. It is developed in consultation with the various stakeholders in the core finance and allied services industry and aspires to meet the significant unmet industry needs that exist in India and South Asia. Nurturing dependable, capable and fair-minded professionals conversant with the latest models and techniques of finance is our mission.

The said programme is a unique offering, which is benchmarked against similar global programmes in terms of programme content and coverage while providing the participants with a strong grounding in the Indian context through means of immersive courses (International Immersion), interaction with industry leaders and on-site/ trading floor visits.

#### **Programme Structure & Courses**

The duration of the PGP is two academic years. Each academic year normally begins in June/July and ends in March and consists of three terms. The students go for the mandatory Summer Internship at the end of the third term.

Instructors choose from multiple pedagogical tools including lecture discussions, case study methods, behavioural and computer-based simulations, projects, class presentations, and various forms of technology-based learning such as multimedia case analysis, video conferencing, and e-learning, to facilitate effective learning in their courses.


# **Orientation & Inauguration:**




#### b. Curtain Raiser (Lead-Up) events for the Management Fest







# Graduation Discipline (2021-22):






# Gender Ratio (2021-22):

# **DOCTORAL PROGRAMME IN MANAGEMENT (DPM)**


#### Introduction:

The Doctoral Programme in Management (DPM) is a full time, residential, fully financially supported doctoral programme of the Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode. This programme provides rigorous, world-class, interdisciplinary training in all areas of business management to equip students with the ability to conduct cuttingedge research of international standard. Our graduates are crucial source for management researchers and faculty resources in top quality for academic institutions, industry, business, government and society.

DPM is designed for a normal period of four and half years. In the first two years students focus on course work including advanced research and doctoral seminar courses. This is followed by in-depth research on a thesis topic including thesis examination and successful defence.

#### **DPM** at **IIMK**

Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode launched its Fellow Programme in Management (FPM) during the academic year 2007-08. From the year 2019 onwards this programme is renamed as Doctoral Programme and the degree awarded is PhD. Presently seven areas of specialization are being offered viz., Economics, Finance Accounting and Control, Information Systems, Marketing Management, Organizational Behaviour and Human Resources, Quantitative Methods and Operations Management, and Strategic Management. Currently there are 105 students pursuing the Doctoral Programme at IIM Kozhikode in seven areas.



#### **Financial Support:**

The important feature of the programme is that it offers attractive financial support to candidates, in lieu of which, the Institute is very selective in offering admission to the programme. This ensures that the quality is checked at the input stage. Further, the students joining the programme are exempted from paying tuition fee.

All Indian students joining the PhD would be given a stipend of Rs. 35,000/- per month for the first and second years, Rs.37,500/ per month on successful completion of Comprehensive qualifying examination and Rs.40,000/- per month after successful presentation and defense of Thesis proposal. During the last six months of the fifth year a stipend as decided by the student's Research Advisory Committee is given. A contingency grant of Rs. 1,20,000 can be used throughout the six years of the programme for meeting the expenses on books, stationery, computers, etc. Further, financial supports for attending National (Rs.20,000/-) and International Conferences (Rs.1,75,000/-) are also provided.

# Doctoral Programme Admissions 2021 - 22

IIMK offered admission for 30 candidates to the DPM Fifteenth Batch (Academic Year 2021-22). Out of 30 offers, twenty eight candidates had registered for the programme.


#### PhD. (PRACTICE TRACK)

# PHD (PRACTICE TRACK (PT) ADMISSIONS 2021-22

During the academic year 2021-22, received 645 applications from 372 candidates. Out of which, 203 candidates were called for an online interview held through zoom platform during June 28-July 13, 2021. Total 187 candidates attended the interview and 50 candidates were shortlisted in seven academic areas.

Offers were given to top 35 candidates in the rank list. Total 29 candidates joined the programme. The 0 (zero) semester, which is, optional for participants with post graduate management degree/ diploma, for the new batch has been conducted during July-October 2021. The programme registration for the new batch was conducted online on September 30, 2021. Semester 01 classes are started on October 18, 2021. # **PLACEMENTS OFFICE**

#### Summer Placements 2021 - PGP, PGP LSM & PGP Finance

The summer placements process for the 25<sup>th</sup> batch of PGP & 2<sup>nd</sup> batch of PGP LSM & PGP Finance of IIMK Kozhikode was conducted during  $21^{st} - 23^{rd}$  September 2021. This year we had the largest batch of 559 students participating in the placement process out of a total strength of 565.

The season attracted participation from 132 prestigious companies which rolled out offers to 559 students.

Consulting saw a 27% increase in the number of offers with 22% students recruited, up from 18% last year. A host of marquee recruiters like Accenture Strategy, Bain, BCG, Deloitte India, Deloitte USI Consulting, Everest Group, EY, GEP and PwC participated in Summer Placements 2021. This domain saw an increase of 27% in offers compared to last year.

General Management witnessed many new recruiters comprising 58% of the total offers made. Business houses and conglomerates like ABInBev, ACT, Capgemini, Mahindra, Rebel Foods, Reliance India Limited, Tata Administrative Services among others recruited 12% of students for the prestigious general management programs.

IT/Analytics has seen a 12% increase in the average stipend with 33% offers made by new recruiters. Recruiters like American Express, Google, Microsoft, MX Player, Walmart and Unacademy along with in-house divisions of Healthcare companies like GE, Optum, Phable also participated and offered roles in Analytics, Product Management and allied fields.

Operations witnessed an increase of 8% in the mean stipend over the previous year. Recruiters like Flipkart, Maersk, Myntra, RPG and Uber extended offers for multiple roles, while regular recruiter Amazon rolled out the maximum number of offers.

Front-end IB and PE/VC roles was one of the major highlights of this placements season. Axis Bank, Citi Bank, Credit Suisse, DE Shaw, Deutsche Bank, Goldman Sachs, JP Morgan Chase, and Nomura offered diverse finance roles and recruiters including The Rohatyn Group offered PE/VC role.

Sales and Marketing has retained its position as the most preferred vertical for the batch. Close to 25% of the batch got placed in the domain with participation from marquee recruiters like Asian Paints, DRL, HUL, ITC, L'oreal, Nestle and PepsiCo.

#### Lateral Placements 2021 - PGP, PGP LSM & PGP Finance

For the PGP 24, PGP LSM 01 & PGP Finance 01 batches, Lateral Placements was conducted during 12<sup>th</sup> - 23<sup>rd</sup> December, 2021. A total of 214 students were eligible to take part and 195 among them got offers from 49 companies. Meanwhile, 192 students received PPO from various companies.

#### Final Placements 2022 - PGP, PGP LSM & PGP Finance

Final placements of PGP 24, PGP LSM 01 & PGP Finance 01 batches was successfully completed during 6<sup>th</sup> - 10<sup>th</sup> January, 2022. We witnessed 100% placements for the 546 students participated in the placements process with offers being rolled out by 116 recruiters, where around 38% of them are PPOs reflecting the trust the recruiters have built with the Institute over the years. Around 15% of the recruiters are startups including many Unicorns that offered multiple roles.

The number of consulting offers increased by more than 50% over the previous year with a host of marquee recruiters participating, including Accenture, Bain, BCG, Blue Yonder, Clarivate, Deloitte, Everest, EY, EYParthenon, GEP, McKinsey, Optum, PwC, and Synergy recruiting.

Axis Bank, Citi Bank, Credit Suisse, D.E. Shaw, Deutsche Bank, Goldman Sachs, JP Morgan Chase and Standard Chartered offered diverse finance roles and recruiters including Avendus Capital, Equirus, Merisis and TRMG offered front-end Investment Banking roles.

General Management witnessed a 46% increase in the number of offers from last year. Among others, conglomerates such as ABInBev, Adani, Axis Bank, Capgemini, CityMall, Diageo, Mahindra and Reliance recruited for their prestigious management programs.



IT/Analytics witnessed an increase of 43% in the average CTC with recruiters such as American Express, CarDekho, Google, Meesho, Microsoft, Navi, PhonePe, Walmart, and Zebpay recruiting for Data Analytics, Product Management and other diversified roles in the E-commerce market.

Operations witnessed an increase of 47% in the number of offers over the previous year. Recruiters such as Amazon, Flipkart, Ola, Porter, RPG and Uber extended offers for multiple roles, while Garena and Schindler are among the first-time recruiters.

Sales & Marketing witnessed an increase of 40% in the average CTC with major recruiters such as Asian Paints, HUL, JSW, Marico, Nestle, OfBusiness, Omnibiz, Pidilite, Reckitt Benckiser, Samsung, Tolaram and Udaan showing their confidence in our talent pool.

#### Final Placements 2022 - PGP BL

Final Placements of PGP-BL Second batch was successfully completed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of February-2022. We witnessed 100% placements for the 53 students participated in the placements process. 52 Conglomerates participated in the process and rolled out offers from various domains to the batch of 2021, who gleamed their knowledge over IIMK.


#### **SAC Across Batches Meet**






# **INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMME**




Even though there were fewer incoming students from partner universities abroad during 2021-22 due to the COVID outbreak, we have managed to send 16 students to 8 partner universities across the world, especially France, Portugal, Taiwan, Norway, etc. One student from Kozminzki University, Poland, also joined in Term IV of the PGP programm.

#### **International Admissions**

This was our first year in promoting our programs to selected countries in Asia and Africa to admit full-time international students to our campus. We received approximately 133 registrations from five Asian countries: the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand, and the United States; 33 completed IIMK application processes; and selected 10 students for the 2022-2024 batch, which includes our first full-time student from New Zealand on campus.

#### **ITEC Programme:**

IIM Kozhikode has hosted 68 ITEC trainees from countries such as the Maldives, Indonesia, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Peru, Tunisia, Algeria, Cambodia, Bangladesh, South Africa, and Myanmar on topics such as leadership and management. 4.0: Management & Governance in the Emerging World of Disruption, Doing Business in India: An India Immersion Programme, Leadership 4.0: The Digital Leadership etc.

#### **International Immersion:**

We have completed international immersion for PGP-BL, LSM, and Finance students through online (due to pandemic restrictions) by our partners, namely Bocconi University Italy and Brunel University London, UK. In the coming year, these programmes will be conducted at partner campuses abroad.

#### **New Initiatives activities**

We are pursuing an MoU with the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) to host the JICA chair at IIMK.

We signed an MoU with the African Asian Rural Development Organization to initiate knowledge exchange, development consulting, and advising in capacity building for the agency in the area of agriculture and development.

We have started a virtual support centre for notifying and supporting faculties and students in applying to international grant funding, scholarship, and fellowships from agencies such as Fulbright, DAAD, UKERI, British Council Education, funds for research, scholarship, and faculty exchange.


#### 1. Academic

Seventy-nine Participants of EPGP-07 Batch and Eighty-nine of EPGP-08 Batch are undergoing their second year and first year of the programme respectively.

#### 2. Admission for EPGP-09 Batch

Notification for admission to EPGP-09 Batch was published on August 16, 2021. 292 applications were received in response to the notification. After due screening for eligibility criteria, 227 candidates were administered the entrance test entitled Executive Management Aptitude Test (EMAT). The admission process was managed in four phases, and accordingly the EMAT was held on November 06, 2021, January 08, 2022, February 05, 2022 & April 02, 2022 Final selections were made on the basis of the performance of the candidates in the Interviews held during November 6-7, 2021, January 08-09, 2022, February 05-06, 2022 & April 02-03, 2022. 185 Candidates, were offered admission to the Programme on the basis of final selection list for EPGP-09 Batch. 127 candidates have since joined the programme.

A highlight of the EPGP-09 admissions was the relatively high geographical and gender diversity compared to previous years. Over 72% of the admitted candidates, 69% were from outside of Kerala and the batch witnessed 3% international participants. 20% of the batch were females.

# 6. Report of Management Development Programmes (MDP)/Faculty Development Programmes (FDP) /New Programmes

#### The Post Graduate Certificate in Management (PGCM)

A Certificate programme of 350 hours duration, customized for Bharat Electronics Ltd (BEL) and delivered over Webex Platform to 25 participants selected through a rigorous selection test and interview process was held. Classes began during March, 2022.

#### Advanced Management Certificate in Transformational Customer Experience Management

A Certificate programme of 172 hours duration with 120 IIMK teaching hours and the rest by Wiley Industry experts was held. The selection is through prior working experience and educational qualification. This is the first programme in the IIMK partnering with Wiley-NXT, the education provider segment of John Wiley & Sons, Inc., commonly known as Wiley for their strength in publishing and educational content capabilities. The programme was over on February 2022 and all certificates were issued.

#### Advanced Certification in Academic Research and Data Analysis - FDP

It is a fully structured Certificate programme for research scholars and faculty to enable them fully conversant with collecting and analysis data for academic research and academic publishing. The selection was held by verifying their academic and research background. Classes for Batch-1 was completed in November 2021 and all certificates were issued. Classes for Batch-2 were started in January 2022.

#### Mahatma Gandhi National Fellowship (MGNF)

IIMK was awarded this prestigious project in its second phase in January 2021. This is a two-year certificate program in public policy and management, sponsored by Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, Govt. of India. Under this program, IIMK is training and mentoring 65 candidates assigned for experiential immersion to various

districts across the States of Kerala (14), Nagaland (12), Chhattisgarh (28) and National Capital Territory of Delhi (11). MGNF is a blended academic program where the Fellows receive academic input from IIMK and gain field exposure while working with the district administration under the guidance of State Skill Development Missions (SSDM).

Mahatma Gandhi National Fellowship (MGNF) program Phase-II was launched by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE), Government of India (GoI) on October 25, 2021. The program has reached the following achievements since its inception in October 2021.

- Recruitment of the Program Management Team of 7 members for the implementation of MGNF program.
- Deployment of the Fellows in all the 65 districts
- Completion of Academic Module-I, Academic Module -II, and District Immersion-I.
- Activated Academic Mentoring Program for Fellows by involving 22 Faculty Members of IIMK.
- Practitioners / industry experts were invited to address the Fellows during Academic Modules, which in turn helped fellows to get better clarity on best practices to be followed in the program for better outcomes.
- Fellows have facilitated and assisted the District Administration in formation of District Skill Committees in most of the districts which is one of the key result areas of Fellows in this program.
- Conducted District Indicator Workshop for Fellows graded by 2 faculty panels from IIMK.
- Workshops / Seminars were conducted by IIMK for the SSDMs & District authorities during District Immersion -1, which helped all the stakeholders to understand the role of Fellow and the importance of including the Fellow in the skilling activities.
- MGNF team visited almost 50% of allotted districts as a part of the field visits as per the agreement with MSDE.
- Performance evaluation of all the 65 Fellows during Academic Module-1 and District Immersion-1 were conducted and shared the performance reports to MSDE.
- Submitted monthly reports from October 2021 March 2022 to MSDE.
- Achieved the following 2 out of total 5 milestones as per the agreement with MSDE

# **CENTRE FOR GOVERNANCE**

Started in August 2019, IIMK Centre for Governance, decided to focus on the objective of bridging the gap between the theory and practice through an informative website, webinars, consulting, and writing blind reviewed international cases. Towards this end, the center has created a detailed learner centered website, documented five international peer-reviewed cases, and has four webinars by eminent experts on niche topics, namely, data-driven governance (Dr. Poornima Dore, Tata Trusts), coordinated governance (Shri K S Srinivas IAS, Chairman MPEDA), collaborative governance (Shri Pramod Krishnan IFS, Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forest, Forest and Wildlife Department, Govt. of Kerala) and a systems view to network governance (Dr. Amar KJR Nayak, Professor of Strategic Management & Chairperson, Centre for Sustainable Ecological Systems, Xavier Institute of Management).

### Progress Report: April 2021 to February 2022

The Governance Center strived forward in bridging the gap between the theory and practice by updating the informative website, having a series of 2-4 webinars, consulting, and writing blind-reviewed international cases. In the year 2021, the center completed its first preliminary draft of consulting assignment titled 'Study on Differences in Free Float and PE Ratio of NSE and BSE' to the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI), the regulator for securities and commodity market in India. The center also documented two international peer-reviewed cases in this period. Towards the end of the year, the center received a consulting assignment, Training Needs Assessment (TNA) of IAS Professional Course Phase I training programme held at the Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration, Mussoorie. This project was successfully executed by January 31, 2021.

The center organized a webinar session on collaborative governance titled "Collaborative Governance and Joint Forest Management in India: The case of Periyar Tiger Reserve" by an eminent practitioner, Shri Pramod Krishnan IFS (Forest and Wildlife Department, Govt. of Kerala) on January 2022.

# LIBRARY & INFORMATION CENTRE (LIC)

The Library and Information Center (LIC) at IIMK (<u>http://library.iimk.ac.in</u>) is a creative and strategic learning partner of the Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode. IIMK's LIC continues to add value through its state-of-the-art collection and information services, backed by its vast and varied information resources. The LIC's web portal has become the gateway for all information and learning resources of the IIMK community. It offers a seamless learning space to its stakeholders. The LIC is envisaged as IIMK's knowledge hub and is the centre of scholarly and corporate information.

The latest in the series of services is the Know your Leaning Centre online Quiz, Children's Library, Library Blog "InfoTalk" (<u>http://infotalk.iimk.ac.in</u>), targeted toward the students, researchers and faculty of IIMK.

The LIC at IIMK is a digital delight available for all registered users. It perfectly combines digital, audio, video and print media with cutting-edge technology. It is a great knowledge centre catering to the faculty, students and research scholars. It houses over 39272 books in print form, over 165 print journals, over 440000 Ebooks, 6119 Bound Volumes of research Journals, over 15000 corporate annual reports and more than 22000 E-Journals from India and abroad, in addition to as many as 3700 CD-ROM publications on contemporary issues.

The audio/visual unit in the LIC hosts over 280 educational videos covering a wide range of disciplines in management. The Video Digital Library streams educational videos throughout the entire campus. Around 80 full-text/bibliographic databases on scholarly information and national and international databases on companies, industries and the markets are available to users through a local area network (LAN). The LIC digital catalogue (OPAC) is also available via the LAN. The portal is an integrated network of information sources. Besides serving as a web-based interface to the in-house resources, the portal also provides links to strategic sources of information. IIMK is an active member of the IIMs' Library Consortium and the Ministry of Education's latest e-ShodhSindhu Consortium (<u>http://www.inflibnet.</u> ac.in/ess). The annual Rupee equivalent of document resourcing in the LIC is around 6.75 Crores. To promote cross-border research and collaborations, the scholarly publications of the faculty and researchers of the Institute are captured and hosted in the open-access Institutional Repository DSpace@ IIMK (<u>http://dspace.iimk.ac.in</u>).

A total of 5182 transactions occurred between April 01, 2021, and March 31, 2022. Of this, 1874 books were checked out, 2545 books were checked in, and 763 books were renewed. 636 new users took the LIC membership during this period.

### Library & Information Services at Kochi Satellite Campus

A state-of-art library has been set up at the satellite campus at Kochi. The students and faculty at the Kochi campus will access all the electronic resources subscribed by the IIMK main campus. Faculty and students are also provided remote access to all the e-resources of IIMK. The library computerization at the Kochi campus has been configured using the world-renowned open-source software KOHA.

# **IT ACTIVITIES AT IIMK**

The Institute's commitment to provide state of the art IT facilities and services to the IIMK user fraternity continued during the year by continuously improving the computing facilities and services. The IT facilities provide support for diverse computing requirements, access to bibliographic databases and archives for rapid retrieval of relevant information and for updating and dissemination of academic and research material. The academic environment at IIMK makes extensive use of modern technology to supplement the conventional classroom based teaching.

To improve the IT facilities at the institute, the IT hardware, software and services have regularly and continuously been improved during the year.

To improve the Internet connectivity, an additional 500 Mbps Internet link was subscribed to. The Institute, thus, has a total of 2 Gbps Internet bandwidth.

Tenders for implementing HCI solution was floated. The work for enhancing the IIMK network has been awarded and the work is expected to commence soon.

Institute is in the process of setting up two e-learning studios in the campus for which, work has already been awarded and the work is likely to begin shortly.

The web based videoconferencing facilities subscribed to by the Institute were extensively used for conducting online classes for various programmes and also for various other activities of the institute.

During the year, many new applications were designed, developed and made operational and many existing applications were modified/updated to suit changing needs. IIMK's official web site, websites for all the conferences and seminars being held at IIMK and portals for other important events taking place at IIMK and various other academic portals have also been developed/updated and hosted in-house. IIMK's newly redesigned web site was launched during the year.

In our attempt to provide state of the art IT facilities and services to the IIMK user fraternity, the computing facilities and services were not only continuously improved but were also enhanced so as to be able to meet the increasing demands of the ever increasing user base.

During the year, the IT facilities have been extensively used by the user community of IIMK.



# **CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES**

As part of the 1<sup>st</sup> Stage of IIMK's Phase V Campus development, the construction of Package 1 sports facilities (comprising the multipurpose/football field) had been substantially completed and Package 2 sports facilities (consisting of outdoor tennis courts, indoor squash courts & swimming pool) was in advanced stage of completion during this period following easing of the COVID-19 pandemic related restrictions.

The unique facility of IIMK 'Gurukul', created by carrying out refurbishment/ retrofitting works in the atrium space of the existing Library building in the Campus, was dedicated to the Institute's community.

Meanwhile, besides various value-addition construction works being initiated in line with the Institute's academic requirements, sustainable and environment-friendly initiatives such as water & energy conservation measures have been continued to be implemented in IIMK Campus.

# **ACCREDITATION & RANKING**

### Accreditation:

The Institute added a golden feather in its cap by acquiring EQUIS Accreditation on 28 September 2021. EQUIS is awarded by the globally renowned European Foundation for Management Development (EFMD), which has been conferred on prestigious management institutions across the world like London Business School (UK) and INSEAD (France). IIMK becomes fifth IIM to bag EQUIS Accreditation. Earlier, IIMK was accredited by the UK-based Association of MBAs (AMBA) in 2010. IIMK was then the first IIM to be accredited by AMBA. It was reaccredited in the years 2015 and 2020. By acquiring EQUIS accreditation, the institute now joins the 'Double Crown' accreditation status, which is enjoyed only by a few institutions in India.

IIMK became the Institutional Member of EFMD (European Foundation for Management Development) and EFMD Global Network in June 2018. The EQUIS Briefing Visit was held in November 2019, based on which the Institute became eligible to enter EQUIS Accreditation process. Prof. Michael Osbaldeston, Cranfield University served as the EQUIS Advisor for IIM Kozhikode. The EQUIS Peer Review Visit was held virtually during 15-18 June 2021. The Self-Assessment Report and supporting documents required for the visit were submitted in April 2021. The Peer Review Visit was carried out by the evaluation panel of four members: (1) Prof. José Antonio Ferreira Machado, Vice-Rector, Nova School of Business and Economics (Nova SBE), Universidade Nova de Lisboa - Chair of the PR Team, (2) Prof. Dr. Jos Lemmink, Former Dean, Maastricht University, School of Business and Economics, (3) Prof. Rishikesha Krishnan, Director, Indian Institute of Management Bangalore, (4) Dr. Rüdiger Hoppe, Associate Partner, Ancora Management Consulting. The Peer Review Team (PRT) interacted with various stake holders of the institute viz. BoG Members, Faculty, Staff, Students, Alumni, Recruiters and technology partners. Based on the review, the PRT recommended granting EQUIS Accreditation for three year.

Now, IIMK is moving towards acquiring AACSB (Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business) Accreditation under the guidance of the mentor, Prof. Venkat Yanamandram, Associate Dean, University of Wollongong, Australia (who was replaced the previous mentor, Prof. Arun Elias). AACSB Initial Mentor Visit (Virtual) was held during 12-14 January 2022. Prof. Venkat Yanamandram interacted with the faculty of the Institute. Based on the recommendation of the AACSB Mentor, Prof. Chitwan Lalji, Committee member of Adhoc Committee on AACSB Accreditation attended AACSB Virtual Seminar on 'Faculty Standards and Tables Seminar' in February 2022 and Prof. S Subramanian, Committee member of AACSB seminar on Assurance of Learning in March 2022.

### **Global Ranking:**

The results of QS Executive MBA Ranking 2021 were officially released on 23 June 2021. IIMK's EPGP was ranked 151+ globally along with The University of Oklahoma Price College of Business, USA and Kent State University, USA and 16+ in Asia along with ISB Hyderabad, The University of Texas at Arlington (China Centre) and Shanghai University, China. 202 institutions from 48 countries participated in the rankings. Last year, the programme was ranked 101+ globally in the EMBA Rankings 2020, in which 161 institutions from 35 countries participated.

As per the QS Masters in Management Rankings 2022 released on 09 September 2021, IIMK's Post Graduate Programme (PGP) is among the top ten programmes in Asia. Globally the programme is ranked in the 141-150 Category.

As per the Eduniversal Rankings 2021 results declared in November 2021, IIM Kozhikode holds 5<sup>th</sup> rank in India under the '4 palmes' category. Headquartered in Paris, Eduniversal is a global ranking and rating agency specializing in higher education. The schools are ranked within each Palme level according to the assessment made by peers: The Deans vote conducted by Eduniversal Rankings Agency.

### **National Ranking:**

Making the Silver Jubilee year all the most special IIMK attained 4<sup>th</sup> Rank in the coveted NIRF (National Institutional Ranking Framework) or India Rankings 2021 released on 09 September 2021 by Union Education Minister Shri. Dharmendra Pradhan. By climbing up two slots from the previous year, IIMK has surpassed IIM Lucknow and is now placed at a career best 4<sup>th</sup> rank among the Management Schools in the Country. IIMK's overall score has improved from 69.96 in 2020 to 73.34 in 2021, and has also significantly reduced the gap with other major competitors. Research and Professional Practice has registered a significant growth of 18.09% during year which have resulted in the improved Rankings.

IIMK has been recognised as the second most innovative educational institution among Institutes of National Importance, Central universities, and Centrally-funded institutions (non-technical) in the Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements (ARIIA) 2021 results, announced by Dr. Subhas Sarkar, Minister of State for Education on 29 Dec 2021. IIMK is the sole IIM to feature in ARIIA Rankings 2021.

IIMK achieved 4<sup>th</sup> rank in the results of 'The Week Hansa Research Best B School Survey 2021' which was declared in November 2021. In the results of 'The Business Standard B School Survey 2021', announced in February 2022, the Institute placed in the Super League-1 category along with IIMB, IIMC and a few others.



# IIMK LIVE

IIMK LIVE is the Business Incubator and Entrepreneurship Development centre of IIM Kozhikode set-up with the support of Department of Science and Technology, Government of India. Established in June 2016, the centre is envisioned to function as a business incubator with a purpose of creating a National Centre of Excellence that promotes innovation, new business venturing and entrepreneurship. Towards this, it seeks to emerge as a collaborative platform that help transform innovative ideas into business ventures that make significant economic and social impact. As an on-campus Incubator, it stands to gain immensely from the faculty members, students, research & knowledge base, alumni, institutional networks and other resources at IIM Kozhikode. The center started its flagship Business incubation program in the year 2017 and so far, supported 89 startups across sectors.

### **IIMK LIVE- Activity Report**

### **Business Incubation Program**

Admissions to Business Incubation Program, Round 1 &2 for FY2021-22 was completed on 10, 12 January 2022. The center had received 190 applications pan India out of which 5 startups were selected to the business incubation program. Three days induction program was conducted via online on 04, 05, 07 February 2022. This program was attended by 10 startup promoters.

LIVE invited applications under the LIVE-SSS (Startup Seed Support) scheme (Round 3) supported by Department of Science and Technology. Under this scheme selected startups can be given seed funds upto Rs. 1 Cr either as Soft Loan or as equity. So far the center has supported 7 startups with Rs. 2 Cr of funding. As part of Round 3 funding, the center received 137 applications pan India and out of which 20 startups were shortlisted for final pitch in front of Seed Support Management Committee meeting scheduled on 28 February 2022 and 15 March 2022. Finally 4 startups were selected for funding and the committee decided to make an equity investment of Rs.30 lakhs in each startup.

As a part of LIVE \$\$\$ seed funding, center conducted the progress review of startups funded under the scheme on 28 April 2021. The committee reviewed the progress and advised the startups on next action plans. Under LIVE \$\$\$ scheme the center has invested Rs. 2 Cr in 7 Startups.

To track the progress of MRPL funded startups under IIMK LIVE MRPL Funding Initiative, the center conducted the quarterly review meeting on 23 and 26 April 2021. The panel evaluated the progress made by the startups and suggestions were given to improve their business. As a part of the review, the committee recommended the releases of 85 lacs as next tranche to 15 Startups.

IIMK LIVE got selected under the Startup India Seed Fund Scheme of Department for the Promotion of Industry and Internal trade (DPIIT). As per the scheme, the center can invest up to Rs. 50 lacs on Compulsorily Convertible Debentures issued by startups which are less than 2 years old from the date of incorporation. The total fund outlay for seed investments under the scheme is Rs. 5 Cr. LIVE has concluded agreements with 6 startups and disbursed

Rs.1.8 Cr of seed funds by subscribing to Compulsory Convertible Debentures (CCD's) issued by these startups. Initially the center received Rs. 2 Cr in first tranche and out of which Rs.1.8 Cr is invested in 6 startups. Induction program for these 6 startups were conducted via online on 04,05,07 February 2022.

IIMK LIVE is selected under NIDHI- EIR program (Entrepreneurs In Residence Program) of Department of Science and Technology (DST). As a part of this scheme, 10 to 15 selected startup founders will receive fellowship grant up to Rs. 30000 per month for 12 Months. IIMK LIVE had invited application for Round 3 and received 80 applications pan India, out of which 7 startup entrepreneurs were selected in this round. Their induction program was conducted on of 17 January 2022. Currently 16 entrepreneurs are part of this program.

Quarterly review meeting of LIVE incubates was completed on 07, 09 & 17th February 2022. Startups updated their progress and shared the next quarter action plans. Suggestions and recommendations were given to each startup by the panel members.

Institutional Review Board (IRB) review's and approve research involving human subjects. Objective of IRB is to ensure the rights and welfare of human subjects involved in research are adequately protected. IRB evaluates research proposal submitted to ensure that is ethically acceptable and compliant with regulations and laws designed to protect human subjects.

In the academic year 2021 -22, twenty research proposals were submitted by faculty members and students of the institute. Thirteen research proposals were approved and seven were sent to the applicants for revision and resubmission. One application which was sent for revision and resubmission was subsequently rejected because the faculty member who applied for approval left the institution.

During the year, the IRB services was actively used by IIMK community.



# **FORUM FOR LIVING RIGHTS (FLR)**

### **Dog Shelter**

A Dog shelter has been established to accommodate dogs, pups, and dogs caught for sterilization. It contains 2 cages for post-sterilization surgery care.

### **Cat Shelter**

Three cat shelters have been set up (two are temporary setups and one with permanent) in various locations. Unlike dog shelter, cat shelter is meant to offer food to cats and not meant for their stay.

### **Vet Coordinator**

A vet coordinator has been interviewed and recruited for all the domesticated, stray animals on campus.

### **Dog/ Cats Feeding grant**

A budget has been approved for feeding animals on campus. Arrangements have been made for daily feeding.

### Sterilization of dogs

Regular sterilization of dogs is being held to control the dog population and the menace created thereafter.

### Sterilization of cats

Cat sterilizations are being done on a need basis.



# **INTERNAL COMPLIANT COMMITTEE (ICC)**

### Continuation of Sexual Harassment case reported on 28 Feb 2021

A sexual harassment case was filed by a PGP Finance student against thirteen male students of her class to ICC. Due to covid and unavailability of students on campus, the case proceedings were postponed for a later date. The case was closed on 17 September 2021 and an inquiry final report with recommendation was submitted to the Director on 24.09.2021. Further a reasoning report was submitted to the Director on December 15 2021.

### Attempt to rape was reported on April 1 2021

A case involving attempt to rape was filed by a PGP student against her batchmate to ICC. Attempt to rape and molestation are criminal offences and, thus, does not fall under the purview of ICC as ICC deals only with civil violations. Keeping that in mind, ICC, with the help of administration of the institute, helped the complainant file a report with the nearest police station.

### Gender sensitization workshops

A two-hour workshop was organized for the committee members on 27 December 2021.

Various committee meetings were organized from time to time to discuss vital issues.

### **Activities Undertaken**

In order to a pursuit to offer safe, healthy and hygienic environment to its women employees, sanitary pads vending machines were installed in the workplace area (ladies washroom in academic areas)

The Annual Financial Statements for the year 2021-22 was approved and adopted by the BOG on 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2022. The Annual Financial Statement of the Institute for the financial year 2021-22 is annexed to this report. The C & AG audit of the accounts have been conducted and the Separate Audit Report has been issued on 10.10.2022.

#### The main highlights of the Annual Financial Statements are furnished below:

#### **INTERNAL REVENUE GENERATION AND REVENUE EXPENSES**

The Internal Revenue Generation has increased from ₹186.79 crores to ₹250.56 crores. However, cash operating expense have gone up from ₹115.69 crores to ₹134.21 crores.

#### **CORPUS FUND**

Institute had a balance of ₹432.02 crores as corpus fund balance as on April 1<sup>st</sup> 2021. During the Financial Year 2021-22, the Institute had transferred ₹88.26 crores to the Corpus Fund as Net Operating surplus for the year. The Interest earned during the Year on the investment made was ₹26.25 crores. Balance of the Corpus Fund as on 31.03.2022 is ₹546.74 crores.

# ACCOUNTS OF IIM KOZHIKODE EMPLOYEES CONTRIBUTORY PROVIDENT FUND TRUST (CPF):

During the Year 2021-22, the Income & Expenditure account shows a surplus of ₹2.71 lakhs after allowing interest to the members of the Trust. The closing balance in the members' account stood as ₹964.64 lakhs. The balance in the reserve was ₹9.72 lakhs. Out of the total available funds, ₹924.57 lakhs has been invested in various interest bearing securities as per CPF Investment guidelines and ₹49.80 lakhs is under accrued interest as on 31.03.2022.

# **RIGHT TO INFORMATION ACT, 2005**

Public Information Officers have been designated at each Department/office for providing the Information under the provisions of the RTI Act, 2005. The Annual Return for the period 2021-22 has been uploaded on Central Information Commission website as required u/s 25(3) of the RTI Act, 2005.

Further, in order to strengthen compliance of the provisions of disclosures as contained in Section 4 of the RTI Act, 2005, Department of Personnel & Training (DoPT) vide its OM No. 1/6/2011-IR dated 15.04.2013 issued guidelines on the following :-

- i) Suo-moto disclosure of more items under Section 4;
- ii) Guidelines for digital publication of proactive disclosure under Section 4;

# SEPARATE AUDIT REPORT OF THE COMPTROLLER & AUDITOR GENERAL OF INDIA ON THE ACCOUNTS OF INDIAN INSTITUTE OF MANAGEMENT, KOZHIKODE (IIMK) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2022.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of Indian Institute of Management, Kozhikode (IIMK) as at 31 March 2022, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account for the year ended on that date, under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 23 (3) of the Indian Institutes of Management Act, 2017. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency —cum performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports /CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and 'perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
  - i. We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
  - ii. The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by the Ministry of Education, Government of India.
  - iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the IIMK as required under Section 23(1) of the Indian Institutes of Management Act, 2017 in so far as it appears from our examination of such books; and
  - iv. We further report that:

#### A. General

- On verification of Form 26AS and other connected records, it is observed that ₹ 902.93 lakh was receivable from IT Department as on 31 March 2022 as TDS. As against above IIMK had accounted ₹846.54 lakh only as receivable as TDS. Management stated that difference could not be accounted as the amount is not traceable with our invoices. The difference needs to be reconciled and suitably accounted in the accounts.
- 2. As per MHRD format of accounts, books received as gifts shall be valued at selling prices printed on the books. When they are not printed, the value is based on assessment. The Institute received 1548 books as gifts up to 31.03.2022, but they were not included under Fixed Assets (Schedule 4).
- 3. The Institute has three Group Gratuity Cash Accumulation Policies with Life Insurance Corporation towards liability for gratuity payments. During the current year the Institute has remitted ₹ 71.46 lakh as Group Gratuity Insurance Premium to LIC. As the extension of retirement/death gratuity to the employees of Autonomous Bodies covered under NPS is not yet finalized by the Government, this fact should have been disclosed in the Notes to Accounts.



 Sundry Debtors under 'Current Assets (Schedule-7)' included an amount of ₹ 229.04 lakh pertaining to 57 cases pending realization for more than three years. Non confirmation of balance amount under Sundry Debtors Account was pointed out in earlier report also.

#### B. Grants in Aid

During the year 2021-22, IIMK received ₹ 8.00 lakh towards Grant in Aid from Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India. Out of the total Grant of ₹ 25.40 lakh (including the unspent balance of ₹16.51 lakh brought forward from the previous year and interest of ₹0.89 lakh) IIMK incurred an expenditure of ₹0.79 lakh during the year 2021-22, leaving an unspent balance of ₹24.61 lakh.

#### C. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Separate Audit Report have been brought to the attention of the Institute through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial /corrective action.

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure I to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.
  - a. In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Indian Institute of Management, Kozhikode as at 31 March 2022; and
  - b. In so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

# REPLIES TO COMMENTS ON SEPARATE AUDIT REPORT F.Y.2021-22

# **PART A. GENERAL**

#### 1. Audit Comment

On verification of Form 26AS and other connected records, it is observed that ₹902.93 lakh was receivable from IT Department as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022 as TDS. As against above IIMK had accounted ₹846.54 lakh only as receivable as TDS. Management stated that difference could not be accounted as the amount is not traceable with our invoices. The difference needs to be reconciled and suitably accounted in the accounts.

#### Reply

It may please be noted that, TDS has been accounted as and when the same is reflected in Form no.26AS. The difference in TDS between form 26AS and books of accounts as commented above is related to those amounts which were not reflected in Form 26AS before the finalization of books of accounts.

We have duly accounted the difference noted in TDS during the current year 2022-23 except for the amount of Rs.2,46,332/- , which belongs to CAT income that does not pertain to IIM Kozhikode alone. The same is to be transferred to all IIMs included in the IIM Consortium.

Considering the above it is requested to drop the comment.

#### 2. Audit Comment

As per MHRD format of accounts, books received as gifts shall be valued at selling prices printed on the books. When they are not printed, the value is based on assessment. The Institute received 1548 books as gifts up to 31.03.2022, but they were not included under Fixed Assets (Schedule 4).

#### Reply

Necessary compliance shall be done in future for the valuation of books received as gifts with the consultation of Library and Information Department.

Considering the above it is requested to drop the comment.

#### 3. Audit Comment

The Institute has three Group Gratuity Cash Accumulation Policies with Life Insurance Corporation towards liability for gratuity payments. During the current year the Institute has remitted ₹71.46 lakh as Group Gratuity Insurance Premium to LIC. As the extension of retirement/death gratuity to the employees of Autonomous Bodies covered under NPS is not yet finalized by the Government, this fact should have been disclosed in the Notes to Accounts.

#### Reply

IIMK employees Gratuity Scheme (IIMKEGS) is governed by the Board of Governors decision dt.02.12.2000 (i.e. before implementation of National Pension Scheme.). This Scheme is operated through LIC of India and the calculation of Gratuity payment in this scheme is based on CCS Pension Rules 1972. The funds generated by IIMK only are being used for payment of retirement gratuity.

Accordingly, with the approval of BOG, IIMK introduced this scheme as a welfare measure for all regular employees meeting the requisite criteria. The IIMK Scheme of retirement gratuity and retirement gratuity for the employees under NPS does not have any relation. It has been started as a social security measure, IIMK being an autonomous organization.

It may please be noted as IIMK Act confers complete authority to the Board to formulate rules and policies for the benefit of the employees of the Institute.

However as suggested, necessary disclosure shall be made in 'Notes to Accounts' in future. Considering the above it is requested to drop the comment.

#### 4. Audit Comment

Sundry debtors under 'Current Assets (Schedule -7)' included an amount of ₹29.04 lakh pertaining to 57 cases pending realization for more than three years. Non-confirmation of balance amount under Sundry Debtors Account was pointed out in earlier report also.

#### Reply

Institute had sent letters for Balance confirmation to all the debtors as on 31.03.2022, whereas only a few of them have responded to it. As observed by the audit an amount of ₹29.04 Lakhs of debtors are ageing for more than three years. This will be analysed on a case to case basis and proper steps will be taken to get it realised in consultation with the departments concerned. Urgent and immediate steps have been initiated in the current Financial Year itself for its realisation.

Considering the above it is requested to drop the comment.

# PART B

#### **Grants in Aid**

During the year 2021-22, IIMK received ₹8 lakh towards Grant in Aid from Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India. Out of the total Grant of ₹25.40 lakh (including the unspent balance of ₹16.51 lakh brought forward from the previous year and interest of ₹0.89 lakh) IIMK incurred an expenditure of ₹0.79 lakh during the year 2021-22, leaving an unspent balance of ₹24.61 lakh

#### Reply

The facts are confirmed. Grant from Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, ₹8 lakhs was sanctioned in F.Y.2021-22, but the same has been received in F.Y.2022-23 only. But Institute has expended an amount of ₹0.43 lakhs in F.Y.2021-22 towards the project in advance.


