



Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode (IIMK) has accomplished twenty one years of academic excellence this year. It has emerged as an internationally reckoned fully-integrated management institute of higher learning. Unstinted guidance, support and cooperation from the Chairperson and esteemed members of the IIMK Society, Board of Governors, Faculty, Staff members, Alumni and the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India and the Government of Kerala have made this possible.

The institute continues to outshine itself with each passing year. The year 2016–2017 was momentous and surpassed every expectation in terms of quality and quantity of achievements. With an exceptional blend of academia, consultancy and research, we could draw upon reserves of goodwill among the diaspora of our alumni, repute among recruiters and prospective students, and a team of committed faculties. It is with pride that I present a note of our achievements during this year on behalf of our institute.

During the year, 19th Batch (2015–2017) of the Post Graduate Programme (PGP) students graduated. The 19th convocation of the institute was held on April 1, 2017 wherein 346 students received their diplomas. Six students of Fellow Programme in Management (FPM) were conferred the title of Fellow of IIM Kozhikode. 89 students of the 7th batch of Executive Post Graduate Programme (EPGP) and 2nd batch of EPGP-Kochi campus received their diplomas during the Convocation. Dr. K Radhakrishnan, Advisor, ISRO and Former Chairman Space Commission & Secretary, Department of Space/Chairman, ISRO delivered the Convocation Address. Our students have demonstrated that excellence is a way of life even outside the classroom. To mention a few of their achievements: Gopalakrishnan, FPM Student won the prestigious Emerging Economy Doctoral Student Award, bestowed by the Production and Operations Management Society for the Year 2016; Govind Haridas and Rahul Kumar of the graduating PGP Batch won The Economic Times Young Leaders Award; **Tejaswi from the 20th PGP Batch won the Cll Agro Tech 2016, India's Premier Biennial Agro Technology and Business Fair Award;** Sunaina Kapoor and Annan Aggarwal, of the graduating batch were awarded the **YES Aspire Scholarship for the year 2016 by YES Bank**. Our students also won the prestigious Accenture B School Challenge: Strategy for a Digital Future.

Our students' all-round performance helps them in securing better placements. The institute witnessed a vibrant placements season in 2016- 2017. Apart from regular recruiters like TAS, HUL, Goldman Sachs, Accenture Management Consulting, Deloitte, KPMG, JP Morgan Chase, Nomura, we had a good number of new companies including Aspect Ratio, BlackRock, Feedback Infra, Infosys Management Consulting, Kalyan Group, Microland, and many more participating in the placement process. With over 111 recruiters and 358 offers, this year's placements continued the trend of increasing average salary being offered to the students at Rs. 17.65 lakhs per annum, with the highest domestic salary of Rs. 37 lakhs per annum. The number of Pre-Placement offers saw a marked rise of 15% over last year. These facts reinstate IIM Kozhikode's standing in the industry.

As a centre of excellence and centre of experience, Management Development Programmes (MDPs) continued to be an important activity of the institute. During the year, a total of 88 MDPs were conducted and 2,052 participants benefited from them. Besides, seven MDPs were conducted during the year at our Kochi Campus. Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs) continued to be yet another important area of activity of the institute. During the year, 139 participants participated in nine FDPs.

Fellow Programme in Management (FPM) of the institute continues to attract good talent from across the nation. With the 10 students registered this year, we have 55 students on the roll of FPM in the institute at present.

The London-based Association of MBAs has accredited all of our long-term duration programs until 2020. This reaffirms our commitment to academic excellence.

Faculty contribution towards Research, Publication & Conference during the year include authoring of 46research articles in reputed national and international journals (including 17 in the Category of A* and A publications, as per international standards). Apart from research articles, our faculty members published five Case Studies with reputed Case Clearing Houses. Prof. Ashutosh Sarkar's co-authored paper titled "Distressed Selling by Farmers: Model, analysis, and Use in Policy-Making" was published in *Production and Operations Management*, a journal that figures in the Financial Times (FT) 50 list. A few well-known journals, with very high impact factor, in which our colleagues have published papers during the year are: *International Journal of Project Management, Human Resource Management Review, International Journal of Computational and Applied Mathematics, International Review of Economics and Finance, Journal of International Management, Marketing Intelligence and Planning, International Journal of Logistics Management, and Journal of Interactive Marketing, among others.*

The Institute hosted an International Conference on Marketing, Technology and Society in 2016. The event was a huge success. A special issue of the institute's journal is being published with selected papers from this conference.

Undeniably, the success in knowledge creation helps us get National and Global recognition. The institute was ranked 5th among all management schools, in the second NIRF (National Institutional Ranking Framework) NIRF rankings.

I would, particularly, like to emphasize at this point that the Chairman and Board of Governors of the Institute have taken visionary measures to take IIM Kozhikode to the international standards which demand increased focus on knowledge creation. These measures, though guided by highest standards of academic ideals, are also pragmatic. They are designed to promote scholarship and academic endeavours in tune with the leading management schools world-wide. Accordingly, the new faculty norms have become effective from 1st June 2016.

The institute's International Exchange Programme endeavors to work with partner institutions to develop activities that foster trusting, enduring and mutually beneficial scholarly and social engagements between students, faculty members, staff and the broader community in countries across the globe. As part of international faculty and student exchange program of the institute, one new collaborative agreement was signed during the year with University of Reading, UK; making the total number of partner institutions 37. A total of 88 PGP students spent a term at 22 partner institutions and as many as 31 international students from 11 partner institutions spent a term in our institute as part of the students' exchange programme.

With its highly qualified and experienced faculty, backed by a large number of committed adjunct and visiting faculties from industry and other leading management institutes including institutions abroad, the institute has always attracted the best brains from across the globe. During the year 2016–2017 we had 67 faculty members ensuring the desired ratio between students to faculty.

The institute continued with its commitment to provide state-of-the-art IT facilities to the institute's users' community and strived to seize opportunities to create innovations. To achieve the above objective and also to improve pedagogy of various programs of the institute, the computing facilities and services have continuously and significantly been enhanced over the year. Likewise, the library facility also continued to grow during the year to cater to the growing academic population.

The institute is poised for further expansion of its campus infrastructure in the near future to meet the requirements commensurate with its planned academic growth. Accordingly, the environmentfriendly yet state-of-the-art Phase V campus buildings and structures are being developed in a phased manner while envisaging world-class facilities that aim for ambitious GRIHA (Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment) norms. We have also planned to build a swimming pool, two squash courts, two tennis courts, and a football field, that would serve the extra-curricular needs of our prospective students better. I would like to highlight here that all the present developments are taking place by employing our own Corpus Fund.

With decades of experience, IIM Kozhikode has been successfully mentoring IIM Amritsar, the 15th IIM in the country, since October 2014. We were instrumental in setting up a transit campus, as well as starting the 1st batch of Post Graduate Program with 45 students in August 2015. We have 104 students in the 2nd batch. The 1st batch of students graduated in the Convocation Ceremony held on 22nd April 2017.We take pride in building and nurturing this younger IIM. This initiative has, definitely, helped IIM Kozhikode in building its brand across the country.

In June 2016, the institute commenced its first ever job creation programme under its on-campus Business Incubator and Centre for Entrepreneurship Development, LIVE, the acronym for "Laboratory for Innovation, Venturing and Entrepreneurship" supported by the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India. LIVE seeks to emerge as a collaborative platform to help transform innovative ideas into business ventures that make significant economic and social impact.

Persistent coordination from all stakeholders, taking the institute to its valued pinnacle is what we look forward to.

POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME IN MANAGEMENT

The two year Post Graduate Programme (PGP) in Management of the Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode (IIMK) offers a judicious blend of theory and practice, and is deliberately designed to be change oriented. The course curriculum is continually reviewed and updated to cater to the requirements of the industry and reflect changes in the environment. A unique feature of the PGP is its in-built concern for the larger society as reflected in the design of the curriculum, which aims at nurturing ethically conscious and socially responsible leaders of the future. The Programme is accredited by the Association of MBAs (AMBA).

Consistent with the Institute's goal of creating business leaders who are socially, ethically and environmentally responsible, each student is required to provide active planning and execution to help non-profit organizations. The Social Development Project is a non-credit compulsory component of the IIMK PGP. The SDP is spread over two years, making it possible for them to carry out the project-related work at their convenience.

The PGP concentrates on subjects in diverse functional areas during first year, equipping the student with basic skills and knowledge needed at the managerial level in any organization. During the second year, students can select subjects in their area of interest. Elective Courses are offered in Finance, Accounting & Control, Marketing, Information Technology & Systems, Quantitative Methods & Operations Management, Economics, Organizational Behaviour & HR, Strategy, and Humanities & Liberal Arts. The programme lays great emphasis on knowledge assimilation and towards this end, it uses a wide variety of pedagogies like lectures, case studies, exercises, role-plays, simulation, video shows etc. ensuring a holistic perspective on the economic, technical, cultural and global impact of business.

The classes for Term IV of PGP 19 batch commenced on June 07, 2016. A total of 345 students registered for Term IV (including 5 DPP participants). Two students of PGP 19 had opted for Differentially Paced Programme. One student was terminated from the programme owing to academic shortfall and was allowed to repeat the second year of the programme with PGP-20 batch.


New Batch:

The Induction ceremony of the PGP 20 was held on June 30, 2016. The Orientation Programme for PGP 20 was held during June 27-29, 2016. During the orientation, different pedagogy and teaching methods were introduced to the students, workshops on "Introduction to Indian Business History" and "Importance of the role of Gender Sensitivity and Stress Management" were also conducted. Mr. Sandeep Chatterjee, Mr. Manish Harodia & Mr. Sahil Goyal, IIMK Alumni had interacted with the new batch and handled sessions.



A total of 394 students finally registered for the Post Graduate Programme. Of the 394 students, the numbers of female students are 103. Two students of Batch 19 who had opted for the Differentially Paced Post Graduate Programme (DPP) joined the programme with PGP 20. Ten students had left the programme owing to personal / academic reasons. Thus, the total strength of PGP 20 batch is 386 and the details are as follows:

Structure of the Programme: A practical mix of different teaching methods, evolved using feedbacks from students and other programme participants, is employed at the Institute. The importance is on learning processes and learning outcomes for the augmentation of managerial abilities. The problem solving and analytical skills are honed through case studies, which are part of pedagogy in most of the courses. The Post Graduate Programme also provides direct student links with industry and enhancement of application skills through projects undertaken for industry by students.

The first year of the programme is devoted to building up basic competence in core areas and in developing a holistic and socially mindful attitude to management. Courses in the first year are compulsory for all students. The aim of the compulsory package is to provide participants with the fundamental knowledge, skills and techniques, contextual understanding, and overall perspective, necessary for general management. Considering the importance of the compulsory, foundation-building courses offered in the first year, a substantial portion of the teaching load was taken on by the permanent faculty of the Institute. The Summer Internship and the Social Development Project provide the testing grounds for this intense learning experience.

Entrepreneurship, Leadership and Consultancy Workshops: Organized three workshops for PGP 19 batch during 2016-17.


Mr. S R Nair, Managing Director, Team Frontline Ltd., Cochin has handled the Entrepreneurship Workshop during Year II-Term IV.

60 Social Development Projects are successfully completed by the PGP 19 students during the Academic Year 2016 - 2017.

PGP Teaching Hours: The PGP 19 courses during second year comprise of a total class room hours of 2750 and PGP 20 courses during the first year comprise of total 3720 hours.



Convocation: The convocation of the Nineteenth batch of the Post Graduate Programme was held on April 01, 2017. Dr. A.C. Muthiah, Chairman of the Board of Governors, IIMK awarded the Post Graduate Diploma in Management to 346 students. Dr. K. Radhakrishnan (Advisor, ISRO and former Chairman Space Commission & Secretary, Department of Space/Chairman, ISRO) was the Chief Guest during the function and delivered the convocation address. Prof. Kulbhushan Balooni, Director (in-charge) of IIMK welcomed the gathering and also presented a report on the Institute and its activities. The Chief Guest presented the IIMK Gold Medal for scholastic performance to Ms. Aiswarya Ram (First), Mr. Anish Kumar Agarwal (Second) and Mr. Himanshu Dhingra (Third). The Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode Gold Medal for Best All Round Performance has been awarded to Mr. Govind Haridas.

After the final examination of the first year, the students belonging to the 20th Batch of the Post Graduate Programme proceeded for their summer internship.

A. Activities fostering Industry Interaction, Career Development and Entrepreneurship






Introduction


The Fellow Programme in Management of IIM Kozhikode is a doctoral level programme that aims to produce a cadre of high quality management scholars and researchers. IIMs see the Fellow Programme as a crucial source of management researchers and faculty resources of top quality both to the academic institutions including IIMs and to the industry, business, government and society. FPM is designed for a normal period of four years. The programme requires candidates to undergo a rigorous two year course work in which the first year is largely common with the first year of the Post Graduate Programme in Management, while the second year is devoted to advanced doctoral level course in the candidate's area of specialization. The course comprehensively covers inputs on research methods and pedagogy in management teaching.

Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode launched its FPM programme during the academic year 2007-08 so as to deliver high quality candidates with sufficient training. The programme attracts talented students from all over the world, and we have created an environment that is ideal for people to experiment new ideas and persistently inspire them to develop innovative directions. Further, IIMK provide the students with the indelible tools so that they can be creative and inquisitive to seize the right opportunities and face the challenges and threats in this changing global scenario.

FPM at IIMK

Presently seven areas of specialization are being offered viz., Economics, Finance, Accounting and Control, IT and Systems, Marketing, OB and Human Resources, QM and Operations Management and Strategic Management. The FPM Programme is designed for a normal period of 4 years. An FPM student is required to take a total of 61 credits and 64.5 credits during the first and second years respectively. Currently there are 55 students in the FPM Programme at IIM Kozhikode in six areas.





Financial Support

The important feature of the programme is that it offers attractive financial support to candidates, in lieu of which, the Institute is very selective in offering admission to the programme. This ensures that the quality is checked at the input stage. Further, the students joining the programme are exempted from paying tuition fee.

All Indian students joining the FPM would be given a stipend of Rs. 27,000/- per month for the first and second years, Rs. 29,700/ per month on successful completion of Comprehensive examination and Rs.33,000/- per month after successful presentation and defense of Thesis proposal. During the last six months of the fifth year a stipend as decided by the student's Research Advisory Committee is given. A contingency grant of Rs. 1,20,000 can be used throughout the six years of the programme for meeting the expenses on books, stationery, computers, etc. Further, financial supports for attending National (Rs.20,000/-) and International Conferences (Rs.1,75,000/-) are also provided.

FPM Admission

A total of 109 students had applied for the programme through online, and the interview was held during April 6-8, 2016. IIMK offered admission for twenty candidates into FPM Course for the FPM Tenth Batch (Academic Year 2016-17). Out of twenty offers thirteen candidates had confirmed their participation. On the registration process only ten candidates had registered. Following are the break-up of the ten students in ninth batch of FPM:

During 2016-17 IIMK students went to three partner institutes for the first time (Mays Business School USA, NCCU Taiwan and UQAM Canada). The Exchange program was made relatively stronger in the last year, by unambiguously specifying the credit requirements for our students and we are happy to report that all our PGP19 exchange students passed the new PGP requirements and successfully graduated from the institute, without borrowing any credits from Term 4 or Term 6.

Another frequently occurring problem is the overlap between exams at the partner institute and the placement processes at IIMK. This at times puts considerable stress on our partner institutes, in order to accommodate our students. This is being currently worked out so that the relations with our partners are not strained.

We successfully completed the student allocation process for the AY 2017-18 during February 2017. We will be sending our students to another partner institute (Cyprus International Institute of Management) for the first time during AY 2017-18 and establish our relations with them.

One of the key indicators for the health of an academic Exchange program, is the imbalance between number of incoming and outgoing exchange students. An ideal situation would be to have zero imbalance, so that we have a sustained relationship with our exchange partners. Towards decreasing this imbalance and in turn strengthening our relations, a summer module on Doing Business in India was conceived for the first time and opened to all our partners, who could not send their students to IIMK during our regular academic term. This initiative was well appreciated by our partners.

The above point is consciously factored in, while establishing new partnerships. This way we ensure that the exchange is going to be both ways, before signing a new MoU with our partner, even if it causes some delay during the initial round of discussions. We continue to consider partnership requests only from institutes, which have either one of AMBA, AACSB or EQUIS accreditation, to enable us to have a limited but high quality academic partners. 



IIM Kozhikode Summer Placements 2016

The summer placements process for the **20th** batch was conducted during Oct 02-08, 2016. The total no. of companies participated was 119 and 364 students were placed in a record time of six days. The highest stipend offered was Rs. 2.5 lakh. The average stipend continued its upward trend and students were also offered positions in international locations across various sectors. The Sales and Marketing vertical saw the highest number of recruiters with 45% of the batch opting for this sector. The highlight of the placement season was the participation of esteemed firms like Airtel, Boston Consulting Group, EY, HUL, ITC, JP Morgan Chase, KPMG, Microsoft, Mahindra, Nestle, Godrej, Goldman Sachs, TAS and Vodafone, which marked the ascent of IIM Kozhikode as a preferred destination in the country for various industries. An increasing number of students showed their inclination in working with startups which was fulfilled by a rise in the offers made by established startups.

The **consulting sector** saw greater participation from last year by major firms like Boston Consulting Group, Cognizant Business Consulting, EY and KPMG. 17% of the batch opted for this domain. Various niche roles were offered by Avalon Consulting and PwC.

A good number of students in the batch chose to go for **Finance** domain. Various niche roles were offered by Avalon Consulting and PwC for this domain. Of the total offers made to the batch 17% were made by reputed recruiters Finance including Altisource, Axis Bank, Citibank, Credit Suisse, CRISIL, DE Shaw, Goldman Sachs, ICICI, IDFC, JP Morgan Chase, L&T, Piramal. The above recruiters offered positions in investment banking, capital markets, asset management, risk analysis, global investment research and financial operations.

IIM Kozhikode witnessed big names recruiting from campus in the domain of **General Management** like Airtel, Bosch, Mahindra, Mytrah, RPG and TAS among others. 7% of the total batch offers were made in this domain to the students.

About 5% of the batch secured jobs in **IT** and associated fields like **Analytics**, with companies including HUL, Microsoft and Shell making offers. Analytics roles were offered by American Express and Tiger Analytics among others. Microsoft offered Program Management roles to the students.

6% of the total batch was offered internship roles in **operations** by companies like Apollo Hospitals, Asian Paints, L&T, Madura F&L and Maersk among other companies.

Students' caliber in **Sales and Marketing** was evident this season, with 45% of total batch offers being made in this domain. 3M, Britannia, Colgate Palmolive, Godrej, Google, HCCB, HUL, ITC, Kohler, L&T, L'Oreal, Marico, Nestle, PepsiCo, Philips, Pidilite, Saint Gobain, Shell, Sony, Tata Steel, Vodafone were some of the major recruiters that participated this time.

IIM Kozhikode Final Placements 2017

The 19th batch of the Post Graduate Programme of IIM Kozhikode concluded its final placement for the graduating batch of 2017. The Laterals placements were conducted during Dec 13, 2016 to Jan 03, 2017 and the Final placements were during Jan 07 – Jan 13, 2017. The season witnessed an increase in the number of first time recruiters visiting campus and students being offered niche roles. Around 107 recruiters participated in the final placements and 355 offers were made. The highest domestic salary was INR 37 lakhs per annum. The number of Pre-Placement offers saw a marked rise of 15.15% over last year. The average annual compensation this year was 17.47 Lakh per annum. This year had 335 students participating in the placement process and completed 100% placements for the graduating batch of 2017 with major recruiters like Accenture Strategy, BCG, Deloitte, EY, Goldman Sachs, JPMC, McKinsey, PwC among others participating in the placements drive. The campus witnessed 26 first time recruiters like Aspect Ratio, Evanssion, Feedback Infra, Infosys Management Consulting, Kalyan Group, Korn Ferry Hay Group, Microland, Payoneer, and many more. The season witnessed an increase in the number of Finance roles offered with major companies like American Express, Axis Bank, Bank of America, Citibank, Deutsche Bank, Edelweiss, Fidelity, Goldman Sachs, HSBC, JP Morgan Chase, Nomura, Standard Chartered, Yes Bank making offers to 26% of the candidates. Diverse roles in consulting domain were offered to 25% of the batch by Accenture Strategy, Boston Consulting Group, Cognizant Business Consulting, Deloitte, EY, IBM, Korn Ferry Hay Group, KPMG, McKinsey, and PwC etc.

Sales and Marketing roles in the campus continued to flourish with major brands like 3M, ABG Fashion, Asian Paints, Godrej, GSK, HPCL, HUL, ITC, Johnson & Johnson, Kohler, L'Oreal, Maruti, Pidilite, and Vodafone participating and offering roles to 24% of total pool of talent from the campus. EXECUTIVE POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME - KOCHI CAMPUS

97 students of the first batch of Kochi campus EPGP01 batch graduated during the convocation held on the 2nd of April 2016.

LIBRARY & INFORMATION CENTRE (LIC)

The Library and Information Center (LIC) at IIMK (http://libintra.iimk.ac.in) offers a seamless learning space to its stakeholders. The LIC is envisaged as IIMK's knowledge hub and it acts as the nerve center of scholarly as well as corporate information. The LIC therefore caters the role as the chief learning resource center of the Institute. The LIC aims at providing state-of-art information backup and support to its instructional processes and research, through world class resources and value-added information services in all areas of management and related disciplines.

Innovations in Library Services and Information Management

Over the years the LIC has registered significant progress and has brought worldwide recognition and laurels to IIMK. The E-Learning Platform developed by the Center for Development of Digital Libraries (CDDL) for the WHO India Office (http://www.rguhs.ac.in/E-learningModule/index.html), the Information Portal for the Coir Board (http://coirboard.nic.in), the Greenstone Support Network for South Asia (http://greenstonesupport.iimk.ac.in) are just a few to mention. IIMK's ambitious Digital Library project (http://iimk.ac.in/gsdl/cgi-bin/library), sponsored by the Ministry of HRD (Government of India), received the status of an example collection from the world renowned "Greenstone" family of the University of Waikato, New Zealand. Another important landmark has been the commissioning of the Smart-Card based Access Control System and the Smart-Gate based E-Security System. The latest in the series of services is the Library Blog "InfoTalk" (http:// infotalk.iimk.ac.in) targeted towards the students, researchers and faculty of IIMK.

The LIC at IIMK is a digital delight, available 24 hours a day, and spans throughout the campus. It is a perfect blend of digital, audio, video and print media with cutting-edge technology. It is an outstanding knowledge-centre catering to the faculty, students and research scholars. It houses over 37864 books in print form, over 167 print journals, over 2,00,000 E-Books, 6119 Bound Volumes of research Journals, over 15000 corporate annual reports and more than 20000 E-Journals from India and abroad, in addition to as many as 3700 CD-ROM publications on contemporary issues.

The audio/visual unit in the LIC hosts over 274 educational videos covering a wide range of disciplines in management. The Video Digital Library streams out the educational videos throughout the entire campus. Around 70 full-text/bibliographic CD-ROM databases on scholarly information coupled with a set of national and international databases on companies, industries and the markets are available to users through a local area network (LAN). The LIC digital catalogue (OPAC) is also available via the LAN. The Library Web Portal is a unique feature of IIMK's Library & Information Center. The portal is an integrated network of information sources. Besides serving as a web-based interface to the in-house resources, the portal also provides links to strategic sources of information. IIMK is an active member in the IIMs' Library Consortium as well as the Ministry of HRD's latest e-ShodhSIndhu Consortium (http://www.inflibnet.ac.in/ess). The annual Rupee equivalent of document resourcing in the LIC is around 5 Crores. With a view to promote cross-border research and bilateral industrial-economic relations, The scholarly publications of the faculty and researchers of the Institute are captured and hosted in the open access Institutional Repository DSpace@ IIMK (http://dspace.iimk.ac.in). IIMK is also developing special documentation centers on 'European Union' and the 'ASEAN' countries.

Library & Information Services at Kochi Satellite Campus

A state-of-art library has been set up in the satellite campus at Kochi. The students and faculty at Kochi campus will be able to access all the electronic resources that are available at IIMK main campus. The library computerization at Kochi campus has been configured by using the world renowned open source software KOHA.



ANNUAL ACCOUNTS AND FINANCIAL POSITIONS

The Annual Financial Statements for the year 2016-17 was approved and adopted by the BOG on 03rd June 2017. The Annual Financial Statement of the Institute for the financial year 2016-17 is annexed to this report. The Internal Audit of the Accounts of the Institute was carried out by M/s Mohan & Mohan Associates, Chartered Accountants.

The main highlights of the Annual Financial Statements are furnished below:

GRANT-IN-AID UNDER PLAN

During the Financial Year 2016-17, the Institute did not receive any amount as Grants-in-aid under Plan from the Department of Secondary and Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India.

INTERNAL REVENUE GENERATION

The Internal Revenue Generation has increased from 73.02 crores to 81.32 crores. However, cash operating expense have gone up from Rs 52.46 crores to Rs 54.02 crores.

CORPUS FUND

During the Financial Year 2016-17, the Institute had transferred Rs 25.85 crores (approx) to the Corpus Fund created under the Block Grant Scheme of the Department of Secondary and Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. The Interest earned during the Year on the investment made is Rs 12.91 crores. Opening negetive balance of grand in aid of Rs 18.55 crores and current year fixed asset addition of Rs 51.30 crores has been adjusted to corpus fund as per the decision of the BoG. Hence, the balance of the Corpus Fund as on 31.03.2017 is Rs 183.50 crores.

DEPRECIATION FUND

The Institute had a balance of Rs 69.13 crores in Depreciation Fund on 01.04.2016. The interest earned during the year on the investments made is Rs 9.19 crores. The closing balance of the Depreciation Fund as on 31.03.2017 is Rs 78.32 crores.

Accounts of IIM Kozhikode Employees Contributory Provident Fund Trust:

During the Year 2016-17, the Income & Expenditure account shows a deficit of Rs 1.52 lakhs after allowing interest to the members of the Trust.

The Corpus Fund stood as Rs 483.18 lakhs out of which Rs 459.13 lakhs has been invested in various interest bearing securities as per CPF Investment guidelines. Rs 23.20 lakhs is under accrued interest and Rs 0.57 lakhs is being bank balance as on 31.03.2017.



We have noticed that IIMK has not reconciled the income as per 26AS with book of accounts.	All tax deducted have been accounted in the books of accounts except income for which information has not been obtained by us.
EMD has been outstanding for more than 3 years.	EMD outstanding for more than three years have already been transferred to other income vide JV 2279 dated 31.03.2017.
During the period under review, we have noticed that amount recoverable under the head Receivables are not yet recovered and necessary actions are not taken. Similarly , payables under the head Payables were not paid.	Emails are being sent for settlements of these advances on regular basis and many of these advances have already been settled.
Suspense account shows a credit balance. This represent non-settlement/ adjustment of accounts in respect of various transactions.	Out of the amount of Rs. 158.85 Lakhs an amount of Rs. 157.52 lakhs have been transferred to concerned expense account. The balance amount relates to credits to our accounts for which details have not been received by the Institute.
We have noticed that in many instances Tour & Temporary advances to the staff have been pending for more than a year.	Emails are sent for settlement of these advances on regular basis.
It has come to notice that, certain programmes of MDP (Management Development Programme) and FDP (Faculty Development Programme) were cancelled but the amount received from the participants have still been recorded as Academic Income. Excess booking of EPGP Kochi Income.	Income is accounted based on Bank MIS. The statements reflected the amount as ePGP Kochi fee and hence the same was accounted as income. However, information from Bank was later on received and the entries have been accordingly corrected.
Short accounting of FDP Income & Excess accounting of MDP revenue.	The excess fee was refunded to the participant on 24.05.2017 as per advice received from MDP department subsequently. The actual fees received have been accounted as income in our books as per the information received regarding FDPOP 16. During the course of audit we observed that Fixed Deposit (FD083340100298519) was not renewed. On our verification, we have noticed that in the bank reconciliation statement of SBI A/c No: 10401159541 an item was pending for rectification since 1 year.	The deposit has been auto - renewed. This amount was set aside to pay the interest on funds handled by IIMK on behalf of IIM Amritsar and approval for the same has been obtained from the Investment committee.

1. BASIS FOR PREPARATION OF ACCOUNTS

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated, following going concern concept and on accrual method of accounting .Accrual method of accounting has been followed as far as possible and the deviations are as stated therein.

2. REVENUE RECOGNITION AND CHANGE IN THE ACCOUNTING POLICY

- 2.1 Interest on Investment is recognized on accrual basis whereas interest on Saving Bank Account is taken on actual receipt basis as and when credited by banks.
- 2.2 Consultancy income is recognized on completion of the consultancy projects.
- 2.3 ePGP income has been considered for the total fee shared during the year which comes to Rs.431.43 Lakhs. Fee based on accrual method of accounting comes to Rs.641.72 Lakhs
- 2.4 Fees from students, Sale of admission forms, Royalty & Interest on saving bank accounts are accounted on cash basis.

3. EXPENSES

3.1 Expenses are accounted on the basis of accrual method of accounting except the following. We have prior period expenses of Rs. 111.03 Lakhs in 2016-17 which was not recognized in 2015-16.

4. INVESTMENTS

- 4.1 All investments made by CPF trust are long term investments.
- 4.2 Long term investments (Corpus/Capital Fund) are carried at their cost.

5. FIXED ASSETS

- 5.1 Fixed Assets of the Institute were acquired out of grants from Government of India and Government of Kerala. Funds utilized for acquisition of assets are shown under Capital Fund (Fixed Assets) in the corresponding schedule 4 to the Balance sheet.
- 5.2 Fixed Assets acquired out of Earmarked/Sponsored Projects are booked as expenditure in concerned project account. These assets are included in the Fixed Assets schedule by corresponding credit to Capital Fund (Fixed Asset Project) in the Schedule 4 to the balance sheet.
- 5.3 Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental direct expenses related to acquisition of assets.
- 5.4 In respect to projects under construction, all direct expenses connected with the construction are capitalized, under different sub-heads and apportionment of this expenditure to the specific assets are done, on completion of the project, on pro-rata basis. Fixed Assets received by way of non-monetary grants (other than towards the Corpus Fund) are capitalized at values stated on receipt and corresponding credit to Capital Fund.
- 5.5 Fixed Assets constructed and put to use during the year has been capitalized as per details received.
- 5.6 Closure report for work done in Phase IV MDP complex by CPWD has been received and necessary entries for capitalization has been done during the year.
- 5.7 Necessary adjustments have been made in Fixed asset schedule and depreciation statements, based upon the expenditure statement provided by CPWD in case where assets have been put to use.
- 5.8 The balance due to M/s GFE amounting to Rs.40/-lacs(approximate) has been set aside against their liabilities on account of their non performance of the contracts besides other recoveries (including outstanding payments ,if any, to local agencies engaged by M/s GFE). How ever a separate accounting entry has not been recorded in our Books.

6. CAPITAL WORK IN PROGRESS

This represents expenditure incurred on incomplete construction projects. The expenditure on completed projects has been transfered to relevant head of fixed assets and depreciation is provided on the same from the date the assets is put to use.

7.2 Depreciation is provided for the whole year on additions during the year.

7.3 Where an asset is fully depreciated, it will be carried at a residual value of Rs.1 in the Balance Sheet and will not be further depreciated. Thereafter, depreciation is calculated on the additions of each year separately at the rate of depreciation applicable for that asset head.

7.4 Though depreciation is taken to Income & Expenditure account to ascertain the total Recurring Expenditure, corresponding amount is reduced from the Capital Fund (Fixed Assets) and Capital Fund (Fixed Assets-Projects) so that the surplus of Income over expenditure is excluding the provision for depreciation.

8 INTANGIBLE ASSETS

8.1 Electronic Journals (E-Journals) are separated from Library Books in view of the limited benefit that could be derived from the on-line access provided. Ejournals are not in a tangible form, but temporarily capitalized and in view of the magnitude of expenditure and the benefit derived in terms of perpetual knowledge acquired by the Academic and Research Staff; Depreciation is provided in respect of E-journals at a higher rate of 40% as against depreciation of 10% provided in respect of Library Books.

9. GOVERNMENT GRANTS / SUBSIDIES

- 9.1 From the year 2005-06 the Institute was covered under the 'Block Grant Scheme' of the Govt. of India. Under 'Block Grant Scheme' Non plan grant was released on the basis of pre-fixed amount on revenue account. Accordingly from the year 2005-06 the institute has been recognizing Non plan Grant as | income. However, Institute has received a communication from the MHRD dated 20.02.2017, directing the Institute to approach Higher Education Financing Agency (HEFA) under MHRD for funding of expansion plans. Hence the Board decided for charging off of the negative balance of the Grant in aid account to the Corpus Fund as on 31.03.2017.
- 9.2 The Institute is financed by the Government of India and Government of Kerala for setting up the infrastructure of the Institute. The Government of Kerala provided the land free of cost to the Institute during the initial years. Amount utilized towards capital cost of setting up this Institute is treated as capital Fund (Fixed Assets).
- 9.3 Govt. grant received for specific purposes are accounted on accrual basis.

10 CORPUS FUND

- 10.1 Institute was covered under the block grant scheme of Govt. of India from the year 2005-06 onwards and accordingly the entire Surplus/Deficit in the income & expenditure account is transferred to Corpus Fund.
- 10.2 Interest accrued on Corpus Fund Investment and Loans and Advances granted out of Corpus Fund are directly credited to the Corpus Fund Account without taking to Income & Expenditure Account. This change is done in compliance with requirement of 'Block Grant Scheme'
- 10.3 In the current year, capital expenses incurred as well as the deficit in the opening balance in Capital Fund Grant -in aid account has been transferred to corpus fund.

12 SIGNIFICANT EVENTS DURING THE YEAR

12.1 IIMK was appointed as mentor for the new IIM Amritsar during 2014-15 by the Government of India . The transactions have been accounted in separate books of accounts .However, the grants were received by the Institute and many of the payments were done by the Institute on behalf of IIM Amritsar. Since the amount was not kept in separate bank account , by the Institute, the Board decided to pay interest @ 4% on funds handled by the Institute on behalf of IIM Amritsar. Since IIM Amritsar.

The total interest works out to Rs.62.73 lakhs (Interest for FY 2016-17 is Rs. 39.65 lakhs and Prior period interest is Rs.23.08 lakhs)

13. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS

Transactions denominated in foreign currency are accounted at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction.

14. CORPUS FUND

The fund consist of internal cash income generated by the Institute, matching grants, donation and contribution by the members of the society.

15. RETIREMENT BENEFITS

- a. Provision for accumulated leave encashment benefit to the employees is computed on the assumption that employees are entitled to receive the benefits as at each year end.
- b. In respect of employees covered under the pension scheme the amount received from their previous employers towards discharge of their pension liability is taken to the Pension Fund account and invested suitably.
- c. Provision for payment of pension has been made as per Govt. of India pension/commutation rules up to 2014-15 in respect of the service rendered in the Institute
- d. We have New Group Gratuity Cash Accumulation Scheme Master Policy No.604000243 & Group Gratuity Cash Accumulation Scheme Master No.405475 with Life Insurance Corporation towards our liability for Gratuity payments. Premium paid/due for the year has been accounted as expenditure for the year.

16. **STOCKS**

Expenditure on purchase of stationeries, consumables and other stores is accounted as revenue expenditure, except that the value of closing stocks held on 31st March, is set up as inventories by reducing the corresponding revenue expenditure on the basis of information obtained from departments. They are valued at cost following the FIFO method.

17. TAXATION

The institute has applied for registration under section 12A of Income Tax Act 1961. The tax deducted at source are shown as receivable in the books of accounts.

18. INVESTMENTS OF EARMARKED FUNDS AND INTEREST INCOME ACCRUED ON SUCH INVESTMENTS

To the extent not immediately required for expenditure, the amounts available against such funds are invested for fixed term with Banks, leaving the balance in Savings Bank Accounts. Interest received, interest accrued and due and interest accrued but not due on such investments are added to the respective funds and not treated as income of the Institution.

19. SPONSORED PROJECTS

The Institution itself also awards Fellowships and Scholarships, which are accounted as Academic expenses.

20. Service Tax

The Institute remitted tax on epgp long duration courses for the period 2011-12 to 2015-16 amounting to Rs. 912.64 lakhs under protest. The Institute has also started remitting service tax for the above course continuously from April 2016 onwards under protest.
