Overview:

Governments are witnessing and experiencing advancements in public systems management practices and philosophies at an unprecedented scale. With the advent of movements like the New Public Management (NPM) in public administration, there is a greater focus on the designing, implementation and evaluation of public policies. As these policy processes are government prerogative predominantly, and its instrumentalities government critically analyzed, more so because of an ever-increasing involvement of private capital. The growth of private sector has increased people's expectations from the government. This programme is aimed at augmenting knowledge and expertise of public sector employees and other actors in public systems and facilitate them to face the emergent challenges of new public management.

Programme Objective:

- Provide insights into key public systems management concepts and techniques.
- Present ways of employing new public management practices for formulating and implementing public policies and strategies in various functional areas of public systems governance.
- Facilitate an understanding of public policy tools in conjunction with public administration and public management.
- Provide a deliberative platform for eminent professionals and practitioners to present their practices to their counterparts in various other public subsystems across governance tiers and geographies.



Learning Outcomes:

- Participants will be able to make sense of the interface between public and private and how to enhance collaborative outcomes, for instance in a PPP model.
- Participants will gain a comprehensive perspective about public systems and their functioning which will equip them for decision making, e.g. enhanced ESG ratings.
- Participants will be able to understand the nuances of situated policy making in a globalizing policy space.

Day 5:

Getting Public agencies to work: Harmonization of domestic public systems

Pedagogy:

- One take-home project to foster personalized learning and critical thinking.
