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Importance of representation of female leadership

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During my tenure at a previous organization which was an operations role based out of warehouse, we conducted annual performance evaluations for our teams. One team member had commenced maternity leave immediately after receiving an exceptional mid-year appraisal, surpassing expectations. It was a guidance to maintain the same rating for employees on maternity leave as they had received prior to their absence.

During the annual appraisal process, which predominantly involved male colleagues, a consensus emerged including the HR business partner (HRBP), with the exception of another female leader and myself that the team member's rating should be downgraded by at least one level. The rationale behind this suggestion was to align her rating with the distribution curve, as she had been absent for the past six months.

However, I staunchly advocated against reducing her rating, emphasizing that she was rightfully availing a benefit provided by the government and that her performance had consistently exceeded expectations prior to her leave. This stance prompted a discussion with the senior HRBP to seek clarification, ultimately resulting in HR acknowledging that the decision should not be perceived as a gender-based disparity between male and female leadership. Ultimately, the team member's original rating was upheld, a decision made possible by the presence of female leadership advocating for fairness and recognition of exceptional performance irrespective of maternity leave.

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Winning the Digital Engagement Brand to Order (B2O) Award 2023 at Schneider Electric for Content as a Service (CaaS)

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Company description:

Schneider Electric is a global industrial technology leader bringing world-leading expertise in electrification, automation, and digitization to smart industries, resilient infrastructure, future-proof data centers, intelligent buildings, and intuitive homes. Schneider's purpose is to create Impact by empowering all to make the most of our energy and resources, bridging progress and sustainability.

At Schneider, we call this Life Is On. Schneider Electric is a people company with an ecosystem of 150,000 colleagues and more than a million partners operating in over 100 countries to ensure proximity to our customers and stakeholders. The company has 180+ years of history and innovation with €36 billion in revenues for 2023. Schneider's mission is to be the trusted partner in sustainability and efficiency.

Background and Objectives:

In Schneider Electric, business units owned product segments categorized into product categories, sub-categories, and ranges leading to the individual products the target audience is looking for.

Previously, plain text product information present on product category, sub-category and range pages without any interactive marketing content made it challenging for prospects and clients to connect and engage with the brand. It was not surprising that bounce and exit rates were higher than normal.

The key objectives were to deploy interactive marketing content such as videos, infographics, and so forth to as many commercialized product pages as possible to improve content engagement and conversions. We excluded legacy product ranges that were no longer sold out of this project scope.

Approach

I managed Content as a Service (CaaS) at Schneider Electric which aimed to create interactive content experiences and enrich product pages for our target market segments across geographies. Being a global team, driving content experiences on se.com products, it was critical to ensure every country contextualizes the product pages to their requirements in keeping with strong governance guidelines during deployment to 60-70 countries. CaaS became the go-to content operating model to ensure brand engagement, especially with priority product offers.

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We conducted an in-depth analysis spanning January to November 2023 to compare the performance of 450+ CaaS ranges against 1,900+ non-CaaS ranges across countries. A Comparison of CaaS Vs. Non-CaaS Ranges:

- 21% higher user engagement
- 1,110% spike in attractiveness rate
- 396% increase in conversion rates
- NSS (Net Satisfaction Survey) Highlight: >60% NSS impact from 24% CaaS pages with surveys (since Jan 2020)

In December 2023 my Content as a Service (CaaS) team won an incredible award at Schneider Electric, a wonderful achievement with great collaboration across the larger Schneider Electric ecosystem! We won the Brand to Order 2023 Award in the Digital Engagement category and emerged first among 24 strong nominations adjudicated by a senior management jury. Interactive content is a powerful way to engage audiences and build relationships with potential customers. As technology continues to evolve, so do the ways marketers can create interactive experiences for their audiences. An interactive "content experience" builds the experience around the content, not vice versa.
