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## **ORGANIZATIONAL LEARNING IN A CRISIS: AI 1344**

## **Abstract:**

This case traces the events leading up to and the immediate aftermath of the fatal crash of Air India Express Flight, AI 1344. The flight was a special repatriation flight run by the Government of India under the Vande Bharat Mission to bring back stranded Indian citizens during the COVID-19 pandemic. AI 1344 was operating between Dubai and Kozhikode. Twenty-one people lost their lives and more than seventy-five people were seriously injured in the incident.

While several factors can be attributed to the fatal accident, the terrain of the airport, particularly the tabletop runway, received a lot of attention. That Air India Express had a similar crash in another tabletop airport, ten years earlier, comes up as an inevitable comparison. Other questions centered on the airline itself, and its operations designed around a low-cost model. Finally, the timing could not be worse, given the unprecedented lockdown and safety measures brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic.

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
